We wanted to have a chat with you but were unable to. This leaflet gives you some information about our team as well as how to contact us.

Who are we and what do we do?

We are the Criminal Justice Liaison and Diversion Team (CJLDT). Sometimes people refer to us as the 'mental health team' but we can help you and other children and young people with lots of things including:

- Mental health which can include feeling sad, angry, upset, worried
- Learning difficulties/disabilities
- Drugs and alcohol
- School, college and jobs
- Money (debt and benefits)
- ADHD
- Autism
- Talking to someone.



Who do we see?

We try to see all children and young people, age 10 and above, who have contact with the police and/or courts to help you to get support for anything you may be struggling with.

Where do we work?

We work in Liverpool, Sefton and Wirral in all Merseyside police stations and courts, including the youth court. We are also based within the YOT/YOS and can see you at school, college, work or home.

Who do we work with?

You are the most important person we work with. We also work with other teams including CAMHS, YOT/YOS, police, courts and social care to help support you and get the most appropriate outcome from your contact with the criminal justice system.

We would really like to speak with you to see if you need any help from our team. You or a carer/family member can contact our team by ringing our office in South Sefton Magistrates Court on 0151 478 6550. This is our main office and we are available Monday to Friday, 9.00am to 5.00pm.

In court, please knock on our office door or ask the YOT court team to speak with us. We're based on the Liverpool Youth Court landing.
